#### FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

"But the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, and those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever."

This past weekend, I had the opportunity to attend the Diocesan CYO convention. The thing that stood out the most to me was the time we had for Reconciliation. I was blessed to be able to help direct the lines and that is where I saw a beautiful sight. The hallway we were in had 6 priests down by me and 2 at the other end. When we started, the 2 lines were so long, they went clear around the corner and down the other hall. People were stacked next to each other and I couldn't tell if the line was going to end. In the end, I think we went for 2 hours of confessions. Seeing so many young people eager to receive the loving Mercy of God was absolutely awesome!

You may be asking what this has anything to do with the quote from today's reading above. Well, here is what else I noticed. We had priests that drove to Salina just to help hear confessions for the youth of our Diocese. We had priests in the confessional that stayed as long as they possibly could, but then had to run out so they could make it back to their home parish a couple of hours away to say Mass. At 3:00, we were down several priests already and we were supposed to have Fr. Andy stop his line to go do Benediction. As I went to get him, he came out, saw the line and said "let me see if we can delay for a little while longer so I can hear some more confessions." He talked to Bill Meagher (head of the convention) and they agreed that hearing these young people's confessions was more important than being "on time." So, father Andy hopped back into his confessional and the people in line were stoked that they would be able to make it to confession that day.

It is in the confessional that we see how the Justice and Mercy of God work together and I think this quote from St. Therese of Lisieux puts it perfectly: *"Though one must be* exceeding pure before appearing in the sight of the All-Holy God, still I know that He is infinitely just, and this very Justice which terrifies so many souls is the source of all my confidence and joy. Justice is not only stern severity towards the guilty; it takes account of the good intention, and gives to virtue its reward. Indeed, I hope as much from the Justice of God as from His Mercy. It is because He is just, that 'He is compassionate and merciful, longsuffering, and plenteous in mercy. For He knoweth our frame, He remembereth that we are dust. As a father hath compassion on his children, so hath the Lord compassion on us." Psalm 103

Within our Hays community and our Diocese, I believe we are blessed with wise priests who are leading many to Justice. I see this as I watch our priests hop in the confessional before every Mass, waiting to give their flock the gift of God's Mercy before they receive Him in the Eucharist. I see this when I am working and I watch Father Damian leave to go to the hospital and minister to the sick and dying on a regular basis. I have witnessed this many times as I thank a priest for their time and they respond with "that's why I am a priest. It is my vocation." They don't look at it as a chore, but as a parent does with their child. They are there to help heal their children and give them new life in the Sacraments.

Please take time to pray for our priests, for more vocations to the priesthood from your own families and those in our Diocese and to thank our priests for fulfilling their vocation, for they are the ones leading us into the Just arms of our Father. May they continue to shine brightly in our community and in our Diocese.


