STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

For too many of us, Lent is a season of doom and gloom, a time to feel bad about all the ways we are not "measuring up" in our spiritual lives. But this view could not be further from the truth. Lent is a season of refreshment and love, of awakening and rebirth. The Gospel Reading, the parable of the Prodigal Son, is filled with this theme of awakening and the extravagant, life-changing love that the Father has for each one of us.

We are all familiar with this amazing story — the bratty younger son who has the audacity to ask his dad for his inheritance early, only to squander it sinfully away. It makes us bristle instinctively at his nerve when we read it. But isn't that exactly what we do when we selfishly turn away from God (in big or small ways) in our own lives? We squander away the inheritance of grace He has given us.

In desperation from the mess he had made of his life, the son finally "comes to his senses" — awakening to the truth that he is a beloved son of a loving and merciful father — and decides to return home. His contrition is faltering and imperfect and seems motivated in large part by his growling stomach. But it is enough for the loving father.

In fact, as soon as the father catches sight of his son he is "filled with compassion for him" and immediately sets about preparing a feast and fine clothes for this son. What an extravagance of love! What a beautiful picture Jesus gives us of our Father's love and mercy. Oh, how this should fill us with gratitude for such a Father!

And how it should inspire us — with just the tiniest bit of spiritual "spring cleaning" we can be sure we will be swept up in our Father's loving embrace and find ourselves feasting in His presence. That is what lent is all about.

> A Hospital Chaplains note from Fr. Damian Richards: At Hays Med, "No Visitation" means NO visitations.

When you check in at Hays Medical Center, I one of the questions they will ask is "Do you want to have visitors or not?" If you say "Yes, I would like to have visitors," your name will be put on the Catholic Pa-I tient List and if someone calls asking for your room number, the switchboard will give it out.

If you say, "No I do not want to have visitors" it I means your name won't appear on any list. Your name I won't be on the Catholic Patient List, even if you tell I them, you are Catholic. And if someone calls asking for I your room number, the switchboard won't be allowed to i even acknowledge you are even a patient at Hays Med.

I tell this because of a recent experience I had I with a Catholic patient. When she was admitted, they I told admissions that they wanted NO visitors. So, the I administration followed their directives and her name I didn't appear on the Catholic Patient List. She was in the hospital for two weeks and didn't receive any Sacra-I ments while she was there. Which is all the more tragic I because I was at the hospital two days a week and a Lay Communion Minister was bringing communion up i on Sundays.

When admitting a loved one to the hospital, or if I you are going in yourself, thank you for making sure you l are listed as Catholic and that you want to have your I name listed on the Catholic patients list. It will make it a lot easier for you to receive the Sacraments while in the I hospital.
