FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

"We will do everything that the LORD has told us."

The above title comes from the Israelites when they are wandering around in the desert. As Moses relays God's commands to His people, this is how they respond. Unfortunately, it doesn't take them very long to completely fall away from God and transgress the laws they just promised to follow. Within a few weeks, they are making a golden calf and worshipping it, instead of God.

It is one thing to call oneself a Christian. It is another thing to live it out. In our world today, it has become quite popular among many Christians to live a feel good Christianity. What this means is that people want the good feeling of knowing there is someone out there watching over things, but don't want to believe there are any moral demands put upon them. Many people want hippy Jesus instead of the life of discipleship. They want to boil Jesus' love for everyone down to meaning He is inclusive of everyone's choices and doesn't require them to live a certain way as long as they feel good about their lifestyle. They can pick and choose what they want to follow, because "nobody really goes to hell anyway."

This is not authentic Christianity, but is instead a morally subjective way of life. Moral relativism is the rotting away of truth and has no place in Christianity, for Christ tells us He is the Truth. What this means for us is we have to be authentically Catholic. We don't get to pick and choose which commands we want to follow and which ones we want to disregard. If Christ has taught it, then it is binding upon us as Christians to do our best in responding "we will do everything that the LORD has told us." This does not mean we are all going to be perfect from there on out and are never going to sin; however, it does mean we take the commands of Christ seriously and do our best not to offend Him. When we do give in to sin, we don't make excuses for it, or try to justify our immoral lifestyle. Instead, we run to Him in the confessional, admit what we have done to offend Him and ask for forgiveness.

As we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi today, "do this in remembrance of me" is one of those commands that many people choose not to adhere to. Instead, they have taken the path of moral subjectivity and choose to believe the Eucharist to be simply a representation or a mere symbol. If it is just a symbol or representation, then the moral obligations to it are not there. If the moral obligations are not there, then it doesn't matter what moral state you are in. Everyone can come up and receive.

As Catholics, we have to do better. We can either have faith that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist and give assent to the command of Christ Himself, or let our feelings rule what we believe. If we have doubts, we should ask God to give us the grace of strengthening our faith in Christ truly present in the Eucharist. If we have offended Him by sin,

then we have to seek reconciliation first before we can unite ourselves fully to Him in the Eucharist. Christ has revealed this to us through Scripture in first Corinthians as it says: "Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself." This is why we have closed communion and why estranged Catholics, or those in a state of mortal sin should not receive, for it is not about feelings, but Truth.

The Christian life has Salvific and moral demands and they are not negotiable. Today and every day, let us boldly proclaim "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Let us live out the truth by following Christ and His Church and may we never forget the reality of Him fully present in the Eucharist, waiting to meet us at the altar.

1.) Paraeducator - Part-Time We're searching for a part-time paraeducator. This employee would assist the teachers with projects, snack time, bathroom breaks, photocopying and other preparation duties for class. This position is around 25 hours per week during the school year only and does not include benefits.

2.) School Custodian - Full-time We're searching for a full-time school custodian. This employee would receive full benefits and work 40 hours per week cleaning classrooms, emptying trash, doing janitorial duties around the school building, and assisting the head custodian with various maintenance duties.

3.) School Cook - Full-time We're searching for an individual to assist with cooking and doing dishes in the Holy Family school kitchen. This employee would help prepare lunch for the students and staff, help with baking in the morning, and assist with washing dishes during the lunch hour. School cooks also assist with general kitchen cleaning and daily sanitizing. This employee also must be able to lift 50 lbs. or more. This position is approximately 35 hours per week during school days only, and this position does include benefits.

4.) After School Care Workers We're searching for multiple After School Care Workers to help supervise the students after school dismisses in the afternoons once school begins in August 2024. This position is for days that school is in session only. After School Care workers arrive around 3:00 p.m. and are here until 5:30 p.m. After School Care workers distribute snack, supervise the children as they work on homework, watch the children outside, and help with other various activities such as projects, coloring, puzzles, games, movies, etc. This position would be ideal for a college student or high school student who may want experience in the field of education (not required!) or anyone needing work hours after school is out! This position is part-time and doesn't include benefits.


