REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Exodus 17:3-7 Romans 5:1-2,5-8 John 4:5-42

Even though we don't have any catechumens, we will be using the Cycle A Readings from the Gospel of John that correspond to the Scrutinies celebrated on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent. The Scrutinies are rites of soulsearching and repentance. These rites are meant to uncover the demons in our lives and to seek healing. In the early Church, all physical maladies were signs of de-So if you had blemishes or skin rash, these were manifestations of demons and had to be gotten rid Therefore, the Scrutinies were meant to scrutinize those who were preparing for baptism by looking both externally and internally to see what needed to be exor-Through the prayer of the Church, an exorcism cised. takes place to rid the demons found in those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation. Since one of the purposes of Lent is that all the faithful might recall their baptism, all of us need to interiorly participate in the Scrutinies. Each one of us needs to look deep inside and see what demons are controlling our lives and then pray, fast, and do good works to eradicate or exorcise these demons. Today's Gospel from John reveals how Jesus led this woman of Samaria to face her demons and to drink from the springs of eternal life found in him. May we follow the example of this woman of Samaria and find the waters of baptism to be life-giving.

Our first reading from Exodus sets the stage for what we will uncover in today's Gospel. The Israelites have been freed from bondage in Egypt. God through his prophet Moses led the people out of slavery in Egypt through the Red Sea and safely into the desert. But the desert is a place of harshness and many demons. The people of Israel are both thirsty and hungry. In their need, they complain and cry out to Moses asking why he led them from the safety and comfort of Egypt into this forsaken desert. If only they were back in Egypt, they would have plenty of water and nourishment. They test God and his servant Moses failing to realize how God was watching over everything they did. God then provides for their thirst by giving them water from the rock. Throughout the Scriptures thirst for water reveals the deeper need to find fulfillment in God alone. How often we moan and complain seeking some physical pleasure or comfort when instead we really long for God's presence and love.

In the Gospel from John, Jesus meets the woman of Samaria at noon. From the beginning, we know that all is not right with this woman. First, women in Jesus' day would draw water with each other not by themselves. Secondly, they would not have come to the well at noon, one of the hottest times of day. But Jesus uses these miscues to invite this woman to face her sinfulness and come to the healing waters that he can provide. Jesus gently calls this woman to repentance and to see that he, and he only, can satisfy her thirst. From the early days of the Church, this reading has been used for those preparing for baptism because the waters of baptism are the waters that Jesus provides to bring us from sin back to life and relationship with ourselves and the community of believers.

What are we thirsting for in our lives? What will satisfy the deepest thirst in our world? Are we like this Samaritan woman chasing after things and pleasure that give only temporary or passing gratification? This Sunday of Lent, as we begin the Gospels of the Scrutinies, let's take time to examine and scrutinize our lives and face where we are going and what demons have led us astray. Jesus gently invites us to return to relationship with him, and he gives us the refreshing waters of baptism to strengthen us and guide us to life in this world and eternal life in the next.


