REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Jonah 3: 1-5, 10 1 Corinthians 7: 29-31

Mark 1: 14-21

Change happens in our lives without our wishing or wanting it. Transformation is our choosing to change and become better. A change in our world is that cell phones have taken the place of landline phones. This change we can't do much about, but how we use our cell phones and the choice not to become addicted to them requires a transformation in our behavior. Today's three Scripture readings are about the power of *metanoia*, the Greek word for radical change of heart...a one-hundred-and-eighty-degree turnaround in our heart. Jesus says it so plainly and yet so profoundly...Repent and believe. Repentance is never just regret or sorrow for one's sins and failures, but a radical changing or transformation of one's life. We can see change as good or bad, but transformation in our lives is always grace and very good.

In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Jonah. the reluctant prophet is sent to Nineveh, the capital of Assyria, to preach repentance. Jonah is hesitant because God is sending him to pagans. To preach to the entire city of Nineveh, because of its size, should take Jonah three days, but God's powerful word brings the people to repent in just one day. Because the people repented, God relented of the evil he had threatened to carry out. In the second reading from first Corinthians, Paul, believing the end of the world is imminent, urges his listeners to be in the world but not of the world. In other words. Paul urges us to be transformed in how we live in the world. This world is passing away, and so we must stay detached from it. Finally, in Mark's Gospel, Jesus begins his ministry with the foundational core of his preaching. His entire preaching and mission could be summed up in two short statements. "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." All three readings summon its listeners to a new way of living. We must renounce all that keeps us from following the Gospel, and must make a positive commitment to following Jesus and his kingdom.

Change is hard, but transformation is even more difficult. For most of us a radical change is probably not going to take place. Instead, God's grace works with our human nature and brings about change slowly. So how can we bring about transformation of our hearts? I believe first we have to desire a transformation. Without the desire which begins with God's grace there is no change. Second, we need prayer to expand our hearts and make them big enough to accept the need for transformation. Third, we need some sort of daily practice to examine our lives to take inventory of how we are doing and where we

need to improve. This daily inventory is an examination of conscience or the Examen Prayer as developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola. The Examen is practiced at least once a daily preferably before retiring for bed. It starts with gratitude or thanking God for how he has worked today in your life. Next you petition God to send the Holy Spirit so that you might see and understand God's workings. Third, you review the entire day being attuned to those events where God was speaking to you and acting on your heart. Fourth, you ask for forgiveness for your failures and sins. Fifth, you renew your heart by looking ahead to tomorrow and recommitting to intentionally following Jesus and his way. The kingdom of heaven is now! So repent and believe!
