Humility and Faith

In the Gospel today, we have some wonderful examples of throwing caution to the wind (in a good way) and having complete faith in Christ.

The first example comes from Jairus. If we skipped it, or just glossed over it, we are told that he was a synagogue official. This should tell us a lot right off the bat. Many people were afraid to come to Jesus because of the backlash from others in their community. This was especially true of many in the ruling class of Jews. Yet, here we have a Jewish man that holds a prominent place in their culture and he isn't worried about what others think, or what they will say or do to him or his status. The love for his daughter has driven him to the only person he knows can help. Notice also that when his daughter dies, the people around him say "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" But Jesus tells him "Do not be afraid; just have faith." So, how does Jairus respond? He doesn't let the voices of the crowd get to him, but trusts in Christ. It is through this faith that his daughter is brought back to life.

The other story is of the lady who has had a hemorrhage for 12 years. According to Jewish ritual purity laws, a woman who is bleeding was considered ritually impure and was not allowed to take part in religious ceremonies, or have physical contact with anyone, (not even her husband) otherwise they would also become ritually impure. So, if this woman was Jewish, it would mean she would have been living completely apart from everyone else for the last 12 years of her life. No physical interaction with others of any kind. Yet, she understood something about Christ that many people didn't. She knew that Christ is who He says He is and that faith in Him allows His power to go forth. She believed in Him so much that she knew all she had to do was just touch his garment.

I am reminded at this point of the opposite that happened when Jesus did not work many miracles in Nazareth. Scripture tells us the reason he didn't work many miracles was because of the people's lack of faith. This lady had used all of her resources to have doctors try and heal her, which actually ended up making her condition worse. She could have very easily given up, but when Christ shows up, she recognizes Him as the Divine healer. She no longer has a wishful hope of healing, but now has true Hope in Christ.

In the woman's case, she humbly submitted to whatever the will of Christ was by first believing in His authority to heal and second, by falling at His feet and telling Him the whole truth when He asked "Who touched me?" Christ wasn't asking so he could condemn her, but instead to commend her faith as He says: "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." In Jairus' case, he had to humble himself and get rid of the cares of the world to save the life of his child.

Sunday, June 30, 2024 ~ Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

These are both great lessons for us as we walk through this path of life. There will be many challenges, and some of them will directly affect the way others will treat us and/or even change our earthly status. We may also have to hit rock bottom before we will see Christ for who He is and what He wants to do for us. So, we can either give in to what the world says and not bother with talking to Jesus, or we can act like Jairus and trust in Christ. We can accept what God wants to do for us and then turn and run away as soon as we get what we want, or we can fall at His feet like the woman and open our soul to Him.

"O Jesus, I surrender myself to You, take care of everything!"
