The Church Instituted By Christ

I was listening to a podcast recently with a famous catholic apologist and very intelligent man, Jimmy Akin. He was on a protestant's show discussing some topics that many protestants wrongly believe about Catholics. The host asked Jimmy what made him join the Catholic Church as Jimmy was not raised Catholic. Jimmy said he was studying to be a protestant pastor when he started to realize that there were many pieces of Scripture that sounded very Catholic. He had decided that he was going to study as many Christian backgrounds as possible to find the truth and realized through it that the Catholic Church was the Church instituted by Christ.

I understand Jimmy's path to the Catholic faith because the truth of Christ and His Church is what brought me to the faith also. I bring this up because we need to be reminded that this is the Church Christ instituted and we should be proud to proclaim it and share the Truth with others. There will be people just like in today's Gospel that won't want to listen, but we have to shake off the dust of rejection and keep sharing with others. So, let's dig in and see what we can learn about Christ's Church and its foundation.

One way we can start understanding which church Christ instituted is by seeing what it looked like in the first centuries of its inception. With Scripture as our start and with extrabiblical sources to complement our studies, we can see that the early Church was the Catholic Church. In today's Gospel, we see that Jesus gives His authority to cast out demons to His Apostles and we are shown the Sacrament of anointing of the sick. Two marks that are still alive in the Catholic Church, but not in others.

One of the extra-biblical documents we can look to for an understanding of the early Church is called "The Didache." The Didache was believed to have been written somewhere within the first or second century and is the teaching of the Apostles on many issues. This means it is a glimpse into the church at its earliest stage. What do we find in this document? It gives instructions on the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and the Eucharist. More marks that are still visible in the Catholic Church, but not in others. In fact, when talking about the Eucharist, it says "Do not let anyone eat or drink of this Eucharist who has not been baptized into the name of the Lord." This means it had closed communion, just as we do today. Only those who were Baptized into the Catholic faith were allowed to receive. Many people today think that Communion should be inclusive of anyone who wants to receive, but that is not how Christ instituted it. The document also goes on to give instructions for Bishops and Deacons. If we look at which Christian churches today have the hierarchical structure of Bishop, Priest and Deacon that the early Church had, there are very few.

To further our studies, we can find sources like Ignatius of Antioch, Clement of Alexandria, Hippolytus, Origen, St. Justin Martyr, etc. talking about the Eucharist, the hierarchical structure of the early Church, Infant Baptism, and a whole bunch of other topics that are thoroughly Catholic. We also see the early Christians quoting from the Deuterocanonical books of the Bible. These are the 7 books of the Old Testament that protestants took out of the Bible and are still missing from their Bibles today.

In closing, this is just a small glimpse into the early church and I urge you to keep learning, for the more you learn about the history of the church, the more firmly grounded in the faith you will become.




