### FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

"For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Yesterday, the Church celebrated the <u>Memorial of the Im-</u> <u>maculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u>. Today, we have the fall of man in the first reading. It may seem like there is nothing in common with these two events, but there is a lot going on if we take the time to look into it.

In that first reading from the book of Genesis, we hear: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike at your head, while you strike at his heel." The word enmity means deep-seated, mutual hatred or animosity. Therefore, the woman being talked about and the serpent will have complete separation from one another and there will be nothing that draws one to the other.

On one side of the coin, we can see how this can be talking about the Church. For Christ proclaimed "And I say to thee: That thou art Peter; and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." This promise of Christ shows us that evil will never be able to stand in the face of Christ and His Church. There will be complete separation. The mission of the Church is to save souls. The mission of Satan is to damn them. That's as plain as it can get.

On the other side of the coin, many Theologians have said this also references Mary. The way we see this is that to strike at a serpent's head is to deal it a death blow. The one who defeats Satan is Christ. If the one striking at his head is Jesus, then the woman has to be His mother as it says it is her offspring doing the striking. But, why is there enmity between her and Satan, and not Eve and Satan?

This actually gives us a good clue about the Doctrine of Mary's Immaculate Conception. When Adam and Eve gave in to sin, this created a link between them and the serpent. This means there is no longer Enmity. For remember, enmity means complete separation; absolutely nothing in common. Adam and Eve now have something in common with Satan. They don't trust in God as a good Father and have given in to union with evil. This stain of sin is then passed on to all of the human race that we know as original sin.

Mary on the other hand must have been saved from this stain, for the only way for her to be in a state of enmity is to be created away from union with evil and to remain that way always. Mary's Immaculate conception and her complete surrender to God's will through her entire life has created this complete separation between her and the serpent and has given us the example we need to live a life in union with Christ.

In closing, this should give us great hope, for in today's

Gospel Jesus says "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." Jesus is telling us that in living in union with Him and His Church, we can start to be at enmity with evil as He and His mother are.

May we all live every day making the chasm between us and Satan greater. And at the end of our lives, may we celebrate with Christ forever in His conquest of evil.
