## REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN:

Isaiah: 25: 6-10a

Philippians: 4: 12-14, 19-20

Matthew 22: 1-14

Some of my fondest memories are times spent with family and friends during the holidays. I remember all the good food my mother, wife, and other relatives would prepare. Along with great food and drink, I got to spend time with my immediate family and extended family including cousins, aunts and uncles. We shared laughter and good times. We often played cards and other games and left the television off. It seemed in my mind that these gatherings were peaceful, and there was a certain harmony in the air. Time seemed to stand still and living in the present moment was wonderful. I often feel this is how heaven will be. While these memories may be idyllic, today's Scripture readings also use the image of great banquet and wedding feast where God showers his love and goodness on all His people.

In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet images a future day when all peoples will come to God's holy mountain and feast on choice foods and drink. Along with great food and drink, at this sacred place God will wipe away our greatest enemy....death itself. There will be no more tears or sadness but only God's infinite love and mercy. While Isaiah speaks of an idyllic setting, Matthew Gospel relates the parable about a wedding feast but with a different tone. In the parable a king has prepared a great wedding celebration for his son, but it seems the invited guests refuse to come. The first two times the guests are summed, the invitees have all sorts of excuses for not wanting to come. They even go so far as to kill those doing the inviting. On the third attempt, the king sends his servants out into the streets to invite all both good and bad. While in the first reading all are invited to the feast of God's love, in the Gospel Jesus seems to imply that some have refused his invitation to the kingdom, most likely the religious leaders of Jesus' day. Therefore, Jesus went to the despised sinners including tax collectors and prostitutes.

What message can we glean from these readings? I believe we can understand that God always invites us to Himself. He showers us with the best of His love.....the finest food and drink. It is a banquet of abundance and great joy. It is far more than we can ever imagine. He even wants to wipe away the pain and suffering that sin causes, but we have a free choice. We can accept the invitation or refuse.

The best part of the invitation is that God extends it to all persons...the rich and poor...the young and old....all sinners are summed to the great feast of His love. All that he asks of us is that we come with the right disposition...the right heart...the right wedding garment.

What will it cost us to live out this message? First, we must scrutinize our behavior and ask why we refuse to accept God's invitation to the banquet. Is it because our work or business are more important than the kingdom? Is it that we feel no need to come to the banquet because God's gracious gift isn't as important as this world and its pleasures? Are we so self-righteous that we have no need of this banquet of love? A thorough examination of our reasons why we refuse God's invitation is in order. After a lifetime of soul searching, we bow down before His infinite mercy and beg to be admitted into the great feast.
