REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN:

Jeremiah 20: 7-9 Romans 12: 1-2 Matthew 16: 21-27

At peace with paradox! That's what Fr. Richard Rohr, Franciscan priest and contemporary spiritual writer, says we must do in our life. Paradox is an apparent contradiction. Two things seem to exclude each other, but after deeper insight we find that the two together speak a truth. In today's readings we come face to face with paradox. Jeremiah faithfully preaches God's word, but in the process faces constant dejection and derision. Yet there is a burning fire within his very being causing him to continue his mission. On the one hand, he feels persecution and strife; on the other hand, he is compelled to speak the truth. Jesus, in Matthew's Gospel, also invites us to live out this paradox. For Jesus says he must suffer and die at the hand of the elders, chief priests, and scribes, but he will be raised to life. And he invites us to enter the paradox when he says whoever wishes to save his life will lose it. In a nutshell Jesus says the cross and death will bring us life in His kingdom. Self-denial and the death of our ego brings us fulfillment in this life and ultimately in heaven.

So how do we come to peace with paradox? How do we follow Jesus' invitation to lose our life in order to find it? I believe it begins with the awareness that we are a mixed bag. We must realize with our whole being that we are sinner and saint, a mixture of darkness and light.... good and evil. As human persons, we have limitations and failings, and yet are called by God to be divine. Awareness is the first step. Secondly, I think we have to come to self-knowledge. We must come to know ourselves. What makes us tick? What motivates us? What are our strengths and equally what are our weaknesses? Where are we light in our lives and where are we darkness? We must, as the great saints came to realize that the closer we come to God the more clearly we know our sinfulness. Finally, we have to follow Jesus who himself reconciled the human and the divine. As Jesus invited Peter to carry his cross so Jesus invites us to carry the cross. He shows us how it must be done. He shows us the way to carry the cross. He is the perfect pattern of dying and rising. In his life he shows us that dying to self and obedience to the Father can bring us resurrection and new life.

What will it cost us to live out these readings? St. Paul, in today's second reading, gives us the answer. He says we must offer our bodies as a living sacrifice. That means everything we do as human persons from work to rest.... from prayer to play is offered to God.

There is nothing that we do as human beings that we cannot give back to God... our successes and failures...our hopes and disappointments...our bodies and our minds...our sufferings and glories.

And so, we must make peace with paradox! A great example of one who did this is St. Augustine whose feast we celebrated this past week. In his early years, his life was one of debauchery and lust for worldly pleasures, but he came to repentance and then to a life of great holiness. About the cross Augustine says," The death of the Lord our God should not be a cause of shame for us; rather, it should be our greatest hope, our greatest glory. In taking upon himself the death that he found in us, he has most faithfully promised to give us life in him, such as we cannot have of ourselves".
