REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN:

Isaiah 22: 19-23 Romans 11: 33-36 Matthew 16: 13-20

Power corrupts! In every facet of our lives, we see the realty of this statement. From politics to government from work to sports, power has a way of bringing out the worst in us. In today's first reading from Isaiah, we see how power as infected the political landscape of Israel. Shebna, who is the right-hand man of king Hezekiah of Judah at the end of the eight century B.C., has abused his power, and thereby the key was taken from him and given to Eliakim. The key, symbolizing his power and prestige, was pulled from Shebna and placed in the hand of Eliakim who would be a true father to the people of Israel.

From demotion of one to promotion of another, this Sunday's readings deal with authority and stewardship of one's gifts. While Shebna is demoted from his role in the Israel's government, Peter is promoted as the "Rock" on which Jesus will establish his new kingdom. And on this "Rock" nothing, not even the netherworld or death, will bring down Jesus' kingdom. Peter is given this new authority not because of anything he does, but because it was revealed to him by Jesus' heavenly Father. In addition, it is Jesus who calls Peter and gives him a new name and with that new name, a new mission.

So how do these readings speak to us? In Baptism each of us is called by a new name and fired by the Holy Spirit to live a holy life. Next, we receive the fullness of God's Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation and are sent on mission to bring others to holiness. In the sacraments of service, which are Holy Matrimony and Priesthood, we are called to live out in a concrete way the call to sanctity. And ultimately each week at Eucharist, all of us are sent on mission to utilize our time, talents, and treasure for the coming of the kingdom. Through all the sacraments lived out in our individual vocation, we are entrusted with a sacred power to bring about good and turn away evil. The question might be asked! Are we abusing our power through negligence or complacency? Do we abdicate our power by saying let someone else do it! Isn't that Father's job! I don't want to be a holy roller!

So, what will it cost us to live out these Scripture readings for the coming week? We might examine what it means to be a good steward. We recognize that

everything we have and are comes from God. In the U.S. Bishops Pastoral Letter on Stewardship, it states that being a good steward means we "receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord". Let's not be negligent or complacent with the gifts, the freedom, and life we have been given as Catholic Christians. Let's use the power that God has given us to bring about change and make this world a better place to live.


